### **Notes from the President**

#### **Clean-up Day, Saturday, the 28th of October**

We will have our Fall Clean-up Day on Saturday, the 28th of October. Our focus will be on removing the weeds that have grown so well as a result of all the rain of the past three months. We will also open the area between the pistol pits and the road to firewood cutting by members of the community. If club members want to get a head start on the firewood cutting in this area, feel free to do so.

#### **Junior High Power Match – Third Sunday in October, (15th)**

On Sunday, the 15th of October, the Los Alamos Sportsmen's Club will sponsor a Highpower Rifle Match limited to Junior shooters only. The match will be put on by the Highpower Rifle section of the club. The age limits are 12 to 18, except that any high school student, regardless of age, may participate. This match is open to any Junior shooter. Membership in the Los Alamos Sportsmen's Club or NRA is not required. A release form signed by a parent or adult sponsor will be required for each participant.

Match and ammunition are free. This includes an issue of 60 rounds of .223 or 30-06 ammunition. The match will be the standard 50 round National Match Course, with 10 rounds standing slow-fire, 10 rounds sitting rapid fire (60 second time limit with a clip change), 10 rounds prone rapid fire (70 second time limit with a clip change) and 20 rounds prone slow fire. The match will be fired in reverse order, beginning with the prone slow-fire segment. Unlimited sighters will be allowed for the prone slow fire segment. Two sighting shots are permitted for the other segments of the match. The match will be fired at 100 yard reduced course targets. Shooters may fire the standing segment of the match from the prone position.

Registration will close at 8:30 AM. Target setup will follow immediately and a pre-match clinic will start at 9:00 AM. Instructors for the clinic will be Wes Shumaker and Mell Smithour. Coaching from experienced high power shooters will be available throughout the match to participants. While a clinic will be held before the match, this event is intended to be primarily a match, and not a clinic for beginning high power shooters. A shooter with good rifle marksmanship skills will do fine, but this is not a place to learn marksmanship skills.

Depending on the number of participants, the match will likely last until 1:00 PM or 2:00 PM. Participants should bring water and a snack.

## AUGUST SKEET, TRAP & 5 STAND REPORTS

August income for the Skeet Section was \$563, Trap Section \$687 and Sporting Clays \$640 for a total of \$1890. We received \$9.80 per case during the month. We used 192.8 cases of standard biodegradable targets. At the end of August we had 844.1 cases of standard targets remaining.

Club profit to date was \$2842.11.

Reminder of the month: Pick up shells after shooting. Dump trash-can if it is full.

The cost is \$2 per round for Skeet, Trap and 5-Stand, \$3 per round for Bunker Trap. Guests accompanied by current LASC badge holders pay \$1 over the regular fee.

Turned out to be a great day for a match – Not too hot and not too cold and the rain held off until well after we were done. We had 22 shooters show up for this one including a large contingent of juniors which was most welcome. I neglected to bring a camera -- photo-credits go to Katie-the-Cookie-Lady and Digger Bob.

**Stage 1: Kin Folk Come'n.**

Got “Kin” coming to town, and one is supposed to be a real “chick”. Ma says you have to take her with you everywhere and show her a good time but this is not quite what you expected. With pistol #1, shoot the pistol targets left to right to left (careful not to hit the innocent bystanders - 10 second penalty each) then pistol #2 but opposite order. Now walk over to the bar, pick up shotgun, load 2, and blast the two bartenders - cause they looked at you funny.

20 second credit if you lift your leg and pee on something.

### **Fine Print Stuff**

We meet down in the pistol pits, the third Saturday of every month. Setup starts at 9:00, shooting starts about 9:30. Bring a pair of single action revolvers, a lever gun shooting pistol cartridges (shooting cast lead bullets only no jacketed stuff), and an old side-by-side shotgun (shooting 7-1/2 shot or smaller). If you do not have any of this stuff, come anyway, as we are always happy to share and carry piles of spare ammo!

Basic Rules: all bullets are only lead & under 1000 fps for pistol, 1400 for rifle. This is because gas checks & jackets can ricochet off the steel targets, and faster bullets damage the targets. Regular lead slugs just splat harmlessly. The cowboy loads are round nose flat points, but semi-wadcutters usually work fine too. You don't want to put anything pointed (including round nose) in a lever gun tube magazine! For shotgun, any 7 1/2 or 8 target loads are ideal. There is no advantage to heavier loads or bigger shot.

You do need eye and ear protection even to watch, as there can be some splatter. Come ready to shoot, we're pretty easygoing & will help you get started safely.

**Lease Update**

Legal issues of concern to our attorney-at-law were apparently resolved, lease signed and returned to DOE. Our lease for the next five years is significantly (many times) more expensive than in years past. There was speculation that it may now be computed in terms of acreage among other variables. In other words, is the archery range, unspoiled by lead contamination and of vast extent, responsible for the bulk of the cost? More particularly, if and when the DOE were to cede the archery range side to LA county might we reasonably expect our lease to revert to a cost of former proportions?

**Opening for Member-at-Large**

John Hopkins has stepped down as Member-at-Large, leaving an opening for this position. John has reportedly nominated some small number of individuals as his replacement, meanwhile nominations are solicited from all LASC members.

**Rifle and Pistol Range Closure Anticipated**

The DOE is to perform impact area evaluation (see July/August Bulletin for details). This will force rifle and pistol range closures Monday-Thursday until 5:00pm. Dates are not yet known. The impacts are from artillery in years past, not our small arms.

With the lease costing several times more than before, insurance nearly doubling every year, and with ordinary and especially energy/fuel-cost inflation, dues must go up. It was noted that dues have been stationary for the better part of a decade, at least.

Rick Staroski is organizing the annual LASC gun show. For various sundry reasons advertising may be compromised, table rental less than normal, and attendance consequently negatively affected. Nonetheless it will take place. Space has been secured, insurance should be in place, volunteer guards have committed. We failed to address day-time help from the Junior ROTC.

### **Juniors at Camp Perry**

See the articles in the September 6 LA Monitor and the LASC July-August Monitor. The Board voted to financially support this activity retroactively according to the same formula as in 2005.

**GENERAL RANGE RULES  
LOS ALAMOS SPORTSMEN'S CLUB**

1. Always treat every firearm as if it were loaded.
2. Never point a firearm at anything that you do not want to destroy. Keep the muzzle pointed down range at all times.
3. All firearms will be unloaded and made safe before anyone goes forward of the firing line. No firearms will be handled while anyone is down range.
4. Firearms may be loaded only when the shooter is on the firing line.
5. Know what your target is and what is behind your target before you shoot.
6. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.
7. Anyone on the range, whether shooter, observer, or instructor, has the authority to call for a "CEASE FIRE" if they observe an unsafe act or condition.
8. Alcohol is prohibited on all firing ranges. No person will be permitted to shoot on any range if impaired by drugs or alcohol.
9. Eye and ear protection is mandatory during firing.
10. Live ammunition must not be discarded on the range or in the trash.
11. Glass and pyrotechnic targets are prohibited.
12. Tracer, incendiary, and armor piercing ammunition is prohibited.
13. Event-specific rules may be adopted for LASC sanctioned events.
