### **Notes from the President**

#### **Lock the gates behind you.**

The Sportsmen's Club is fenced and gated because DOE required more stringent access controls to the LASC shooting ranges. Each club member entering the range must secure the gate behind them unless it is during a club sanctioned event open to the public, in which case the gate may remain open during the event. The gate must be closed at the end of the event that is open to the public. Do not leave the gate open for your own personal convenience. With hunting seasons on us, it is especially important that we keep the gates locked and limit access only to LASC members and their guests.

#### **Clean-up Day, Saturday, the 28th of October**

We will have our Fall Clean-up Day on Saturday, the 28th of October. Our focus will be on removing the weeds that have grown so well as a result of all the rain of the past three months. We will also open the area between the pistol pits and the road to firewood cutting by members of the community. If club members want to get a head start on the firewood cutting in this area, feel free to do so.

## **Safety problem with the backstop at the indoor range**

We had a problem with the backstop in the indoor range. Last week during Los Alamos County Police Department training, Reid Zirkle, the firearms instructor noticed that ricochets were coming back towards the shooters from the backstop. He inspected the backstop and found that one of the four-foot sections was plugged at the lowest baffle. Reid showed me the problem right before the board meeting on Thursday. On Friday evening and Saturday morning I took apart that section of the backstop and cleaned out the lead that has fused on the bottom baffle. I learned more about the backstop than I wanted to, but I am also very impressed by both the design of the backstop and by the quality of the steel in it. We will need to have a regular inspection program to insure that the lead doesn't build up on the lowest baffles, especially in the center section which see the heaviest use.

Elsewhere in this bulletin I have provided a description, with pictures, of the plugged baffle. We will also post pictures on the wall near the backstop. Before you use the indoor range, inspect the backstop. Insure that the lowest plates are in place and that the lowest baffle is not plugged. Also, do not use composition board for target backing. This creates a lot of residue which fills the lead catch pans. Use only paper and cardboard targets.

Click on "View seller's other items" to see the other half dozen auctions we have going. My e-Bay id is marv\_223, so you can look up the auctions that way as well.

Scrap brass donations are solicited, as well. Berdan primed .308 cases are worth about 2 cents each if we get together a thousand pounds of them. Scrap brass is more than double what I received about a year ago. And, if we can assemble 1000#, then we can get another 20% or so from one of the dealers in Albuquerque. There's probably a good investment lesson here—with the economies of China and India growing, the market for metals in wide-spread use will just continue to climb. Scrap copper is out of sight, price-wise.

If you have donations, just put them in the clubhouse with a sign on them that says they're donations to the junior program. I'm at the range a little bit most week-end days and will pick them up then, or if you send me e-mail saying you've left something, I'll get it that evening or the next day. My conservative goal for this campaign is \$1000. My real goal is \$2000, but it takes a lot of time to sort the materials, write the ads, and package the shipments. I'll keep going until about Thanksgiving, but then shut down the auctions until after the first of the year.

**Bill Laughlin Memorial Junior High Power Rifle Match  
Sunday, October 15, 2006**

On Sunday, the 15th of October, the Los Alamos Sportsmen's Club will host the Bill Laughlin Memorial Junior High Power Match. This match, sponsored by friends of Bill Laughlin and by LASC, will pay tribute to a long-time LASC member who provided years of service to the club. The match is limited to Junior shooters only. The match will be put on by the Highpower Rifle section of the club. The age limits are 12 to 18, except that any high school student, regardless of age, may participate. This match is open to any Junior shooter. Membership in the Los Alamos Sportsmen's Club or NRA is not required. A release form signed by a parent or adult sponsor will be required for each participant.

Match and ammunition are free. This includes an issue of 60 rounds of .223 or 30-06 ammunition. The match will be the standard 50 round National Match Course, with 10 rounds standing slow-fire, 10 rounds sitting rapid fire (60 second time limit with a clip change), 10 rounds prone rapid fire (70 second time limit with a clip change) and 20 rounds prone slow fire. The match will be fired in reverse order, beginning with the prone slow-fire segment. Unlimited sighters will be allowed for the prone slow fire segment. Two sighting shots are permitted for the other segments of the match. The match will be fired at 100 yard reduced course targets. Shooters may fire the standing segment of the match from the prone position.

Registration will close at 8:30 AM. Target setup will follow immediately and a pre-match clinic will start at 9:00 AM. Instructors for the clinic will be Wes Shumaker and Mell Smithour. Coaching from experienced high power shooters will be available throughout the match to participants. While a clinic will be held before the match, this event is intended to be primarily a match and not a clinic for beginning high power shooters. A shooter with good rifle marksmanship skills will do fine, but this is not a place to learn marksmanship skills.

Depending on the number of participants, the match will likely last until 1:00 PM or 2:00 PM. Participants should bring water and a snack.

The club has several match grade AR15 rifles that will be available for loan to participants. The club also has two M1 carbines and several M1 Garand rifles available for loan. Ear and eye protection is required for each participant. Ear protectors and glasses will be available for loan. ## JOHN FARNAM'S QUIPS

### Four Features

In recent times, handgun specifications promulgated by police departments have been updated to reflect new developments in the industry. Of course all the usual items are still mentioned, e.g.: accuracy, reliability, et al, but these are now with us too:

(1) Adjustable grip size. The S&W M&P, Beretta PX4, Kimber KPD, and a number of other modern pistols now have this feature. The grip can be made larger or smaller via interchangeable attachments that are supplied with each pistol. This makes it possible for the same pistol to be comfortably used by everyone within a department, regardless of hand size or finger length. Adjustable grip size eliminates innumerable equipment complaints and thus, popular with chiefs.

(2) Double-drop. Self-decocking (DAO) autoloaders are now the norm in American police circles, but most do not permit the hammer to be dropped on a recalcitrant primer a second time. Once the hammer is down, releasing and pressing the trigger a second time will not recock and fire the pistol. The slide must be reciprocated before the trigger is active again. The SIG/DAK is a notable exception. It does double-drop, a feature considered significant by many.

(3) Hammer fired vs. striker fired. A traditional, arcing hammer will predictably deliver a heavier blow to the chambered cartridge's primer than will a "striker", which is little more than a spring-loaded firing pin. Many design engineers thus insist that hammer-fired pistols provide inherently more reliable ignition than do striker-fired ones. However, many trainers insist that a pistol with a hammer that visibly moves as the trigger is pressed is distracting to beginning students who should be learning to watch the front sight. No striker-fired pistol features double-drop.

(4) Field stripping without the necessity of first dry-firing the pistol. This is primarily a training/common-sense issue, but it has garnered the attention of many chiefs. The industry has taken notice. For example, the Beretta PX4 comes apart exactly as does a Glock, absent the dry-fire-first requirement.

Interestingly, Glock pistols, which are currently the top sellers, feature none of the above, and no pistol I know of features them all. However, it is fair to say that smart manufacturers will continue to modify products and create new ones in an effort to claim market share. And, when one wants to sell pistols in America, he has to sell them to police chiefs. Pistols not popular with police will not be popular in the general market.

## OCTOBER SKEET, TRAP & 5 STAND REPORTS

September income for the Skeet Section was \$605, Trap Section \$372 and Sporting Clays \$504 for a total of \$1481. We received \$7.24 per case during the month. We used 204.5 cases of standard biodegradable targets. At the end of September we had 639.6 cases of standard targets remaining. Club profit to date was \$2842.11.

Last month we collected slightly more than the cost of the targets (\$7.06). We usually collect about \$10 per case. We either lost money during September or targets are missing. If anyone is aware of this disparity please call Ed Bush 662-7584.

Reminder of the month: Pick up shells after shooting. Dump trash can if it is full.

The cost is \$2 per round for Skeet, Trap and 5-Stand, \$3 per round for Bunker Trap. Guests accompanied by current LASC badge holders pay \$1 over the regular fee.

**REMEMBER TO VOTE ON NOVEMBER 7**

**NAMES IN BOLD ARE CANDIDATES ENDORSED BY THE NRA-PVF**

**A+** An incumbent with not only an excellent voting record on critical NRA issues, but who has also made a vigorous effort to promote the Second Amendment.

**A** Solidly pro-gun candidate. An “A” incumbent who has supported NRA positions on key votes. May also describe a non-incumbent “A” candidate (one not represented with an \*) who has previously held other office and cast consistent pro-gun votes, or an “A” candidate who hasn’t held office but has expressed strong support for NRA positions on Second Amendment issues. It should be noted that a “non-incumbent” candidate may have been awarded the “A” rating due solely to their responses on the NRA-PVF candidate survey.

**B** A generally pro-gun candidate, but a “B” incumbent may have voted for some restrictive legislation in the past. A “B” candidate who hasn’t held office may have made some statements or taken positions against the NRA on some issues.

**C** Not necessarily a passing grade. A “C” candidate may have cast some pro-gun votes in the past but has also recently cast key votes or made some statements contrary to NRA positions on key issues.

**D** An anti-gun candidate who has frequently voted for restrictive gun control legislation or made strong statements in opposition to Second Amendment rights, and regardless of public statements can definitely not be counted on in key votes.

**F** True enemy of gun owners’ rights. A vehement anti-gun candidate who always opposes gun owners’ rights and/or actively leads anti-gun legislative efforts, or sponsors anti-gun legislation.

**?** Failed to answer NRA-PVF candidate questionnaire, often an indication of indifference, if not outright hostility, to gun owners’ and sportsmen’s rights.

\* Indicates an incumbent running for re-election.

**GENERAL RANGE RULES  
LOS ALAMOS SPORTSMEN'S CLUB**

1. Always treat every firearm as if it were loaded.
2. Never point a firearm at anything that you do not want to destroy. Keep the muzzle pointed down range at all times.
3. All firearms will be unloaded and made safe before anyone goes forward of the firing line. No firearms will be handled while anyone is down range.
4. Firearms may be loaded only when the shooter is on the firing line.
5. Know what your target is and what is behind your target before you shoot.
6. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on the target.
7. Anyone on the range, whether shooter, observer, or instructor, has the authority to call for a "CEASE FIRE" if they observe an unsafe act or condition.
8. Alcohol is prohibited on all firing ranges. No person will be permitted to shoot on any range if impaired by drugs or alcohol.
9. Eye and ear protection is mandatory during firing.
10. Live ammunition must not be discarded on the range or in the trash.
11. Glass and pyrotechnic targets are prohibited.
12. Tracer, incendiary, and armor piercing ammunition is prohibited.
13. Event-specific rules may be adopted for LASC sanctioned events.
